



HERITAGE SITES REOPEN

VICTORIA DAY WEEKEND

Open Wednesday to Sunday all season long

Open late (until 7pm) Fridays & Saturdays

The Michener House Museum and Lacombe Blacksmith Shop Museum will reopen to the public **Victoria Day weekend** in May, and remain open 5 days a week until **Labour Day Weekend** in September.

Costumed interpreters will be on hand giving tours and running heritage demonstrations 10-4 pm, and until 7pm on Fridays and Saturdays.

New Heritage Learning Garden will have its grand opening in late-June 2022. Guided tours and programming will occur during regular hours, and the space will be open for public use year-round.

1867: Rebellion and Confederation

School / Home School Field Trips


In May and June, we are scheduling school field trips to the heritage sites. Teachers and education providers can pick between curriculum-focused programs, half-day tours or full-day tours.
